

Java Licensing FAQ

Executive Summary

- Oracle announced in 2019 that Java would now require a paid subscription
- Additionally, as of January 2023, Oracle has announced a new “Per Employee” metric, requiring all employees to be licensed for Java
- In Oracle’s view, every desktop, server, and employee uses Java. This could translate into hundreds of thousands or even millions of dollars in unexpected costs annually for Java subscriptions
- Oracle has assigned certain releases and updates of Java as Freeware, along with others to be considered commercial or requiring a subscription. To understand these differences, along with Support options and Java Subscription Term options, please refer to the Appendix of this FAQ

Questions

How do I locate devices that use Java?

It is easier to define where Java is not used or not needed than to determine where it is installed. This is still true for those organizations who have not segregated their Java environment. Virtually every server, desktop, and laptop has Java installed either through imaging or “clone-and-clip” deployment approaches. Moreover, applications, devices, and users can often download Java updates or a new release version that requires a subscription.

How much does an Oracle Java subscription cost?

Oracle had previously announced that the pricing will be \$2.50 per user (desktop or laptop) per month; or \$25.00 per licensable core per month. There are tiers based on the quantity of license subscriptions. However, this pricing was only available until March 1, 2023. New subscriptions are based upon the new “Per Employee” metric. However, there may be methods to mitigate some of the impact of this change.

How does Oracle define an employee?

Oracle defines an employee as:

"(i) all of Your full-time, part-time, temporary employees, and (ii) all of the full-time employees, part-time employees and temporary employees of Your agents, contractors, outsourcers, and consultants that support Your internal business operations."

This means their definition is very inclusive. Even if your employee, contractor, or agent doesn't use Oracle Java or even a computer, they will still require an Oracle Java subscription.

Are there Java alternatives?

Yes, you can switch to Open Oracle JDK or to any of the others, but this might not be practical for your organization for numerous reasons.

What if I'm not an Oracle customer?

If you are using the Oracle Java – formerly, Sun Java – you still need to pay for a Java subscription, both to stay in legal compliance and to receive security updates.

Will Oracle "Grandfather" users who installed Java before this announcement?

No, Oracle has not announced any provisions for grandfathering historic users. All new Oracle Java versions and updates will require a subscription.

Are all the current releases of Java licensable?

No. The Oracle Java 8 releases after January 2019 will require a subscription. There are some exceptions, however, Oracle has announced that version 17 is a long-term support (LTS) version and is free to use commercially until September 2024. Additionally, version 21, which came out in Sept 2023, and is also long-term support (LTS) version, is free to use commercially until September 2026.

(Note: Only Java 7 and above are supported by Oracle. Java 7 has exited Extended Support effective July 2022. Java 8 is already in Extended Support through December 2030.)

Will Java automatically update itself from a free version to a paid version?

Yes. However, this can be circumvented if you disable the automatic update feature, and make other changes.

What information does Oracle Java send to Oracle about me when it “phones home” (collects data)?

Oracle states that they do not collect personally identifiable information. They describe it as “*anonymous technical data*” that they call “*telemetry*.” However, Oracle gets informed whenever someone within your organization downloads Java. Such things as “*Method/Venue*” which Oracle defines as indicating “... *if it is an auto-update transaction... [or] a manual download...*”. IP Address is mentioned as part of the data, which could be a security-related issue.

Why does Java “phone home”?

They indicate that the “... *purpose of the telemetry transmitted to Oracle during the Java installation and auto-update process is to find any technical problems or anomalies that occur...*” such as a missing file or compatibility with an updated browser.

When does Java “phone home”?

Oracle is notified upon any download of Java and periodically during subsequent automatic updates of Java if they are not disabled.

Can I install it manually without Java “phoning home”?

Yes, Oracle does provide a method to install Java without the initial data collection. Go to <https://www.java.com/en/download/manual.jsp> and follow the instructions about not being connected to the internet.

Can I turn off the “phone home” function for Java?

Yes, there is a detailed way on how to limit the notifications received by Oracle. Go to https://www.java.com/en/download/help/java_update.html for those instructions.
